The interesting constraint is that this show happens on a $20" \times 30"$ plinth that will be located within his larger show., and the timelines were very short -- about 6 weeks between invitation and install

With that timeline, I couldn't overthink the theme. "On Reflection" was a natural way to converse with the parent show.

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
City of Light

Inspired by the ubiquitous ironwork window railings of Paris, with a nod to the Catholic culture of its secular society, this image emerged from the idea of Euler spirals reflected in an Euler spiral.

An Euler spiral's curvature changes in proportion to the distance along the curve. It converges on a point but never gets there. As a mathematician by training and a pedant by inclination, I have to admit the Euler spirals are limited and approximate..

Narcissus' Last Tear






Unintended Consequence
